# **PERSONAL STORIES**

The towns and sights of Slovenian Istria boast a range of unique architecture from times gone by, events and stories linked to maritime, fishing and salt panning traditions.

Despite being relatively close to each other, each town retains its individuality and provides a unique experience! Piran boasts about its medieval roots, picturesque views, salt pans and comprehensive tourist offerings all over Portorož. Izola, a fishing town, is brimming with maritime tales of brave fishermen and is home to beautiful beaches under the cliff. Koper, with its Venetian palaces, connects the coastline with the green countryside. Ankaran offers a great place for relaxation on one of its spacious beaches and the exceptional nature of Debeli Rtič.

Portorož is and has been a well-known climatic health resort for centuries. Its lively seaside promenade invites you to visit its spas and resorts with the most comprehensive offers by far. VIEW THE EXHIBITIONS AT SALT WAREHOUSES

When you first enter Portorož it is impossible not to notice the magnificent architecture of the Palace Hotel, boasting with over a century old history. It is one of the most prestigious hotels of the then Austro-Hungarian Riviera, in which brine and mud therapies were performed at the beginning of the 20th century. It remains a cultural monument and a luxury hotel of the highest class. The imposing buildings of the former salt warehouses Monfort and Grando once stored the local salt worker's annual harvest behind thick walls and under 28-meter-long beams. Today, the buildings display the Maritime Museum's collections and host exhibitions of contemporary art and many other events. The largest sandy beach in Slovenia invites you to go swimming, go for a walk, play beach volleyball and enjoy summer evening concerts and cinema under the stars. Its blue flag awarded beach includes a children's playground and many terraces where you can enjoy everything from good food, ice cream and coffee to your favourite cocktail.

**ENJOY THE SANDY BEACH** 

PIRAN, A TOWN N BY

Piran is the most beautiful and the most photogenic medieval town on the Slovenian coast. Just walking through its squares and alleys is a memorable experience in itself. Climb up to the majestic walls above it and enjoy the views of our beautiful Istria. Admire the silhouette of the town with a promenade by the sea, extending to Portorož all the way to the Sečovlje salt pans.

# STOP AT THE TARTINI SQUARE VISIT PIRAN'S CHURCHES

The square, with its characteristic elliptical shape, is dedicated to the Piran violin virtuoso Giuseppe Tartini. The square is surrounded by the violinist's birth house, the Venetian House and other important buildings. The square is also the ideal starting point on your exploration of the town. Piran's rich sacral heritage means that it is home to eleven churches. The largest of them all is the church of Piran's patron St. George. It sits atop a hill overlooking the town and the bay. Among the churches you will also find a Minorite monastery. Inside it is the acoustic cross corridor where the Tartini Festival is held.



**EXPLORE THE TOWN'S WALLS** 

Piran town's landscape is also shaped by the preserved remains of the mighty walls. They stand at the edge of the town and are easily visible. Discover the preserved city gates and explore the defensive towers with the most beautiful views of Piran.



# The town that was once an island is famous for its

fishing, fish processing, winemaking and oil making tradition. The medieval town, with its narrow streets and a church on a hill, entices visitors with its many

parks and as many as eight beaches. Next to the historical harbour known as Mandrač there is also a modern marina.

# FISHERMAN'S TOWN

## **A VIEW OF IZOLA FROM ST. MAURUS**

The church sitting on the highest point of the former island creates a distinctive silhouette of the city. The top of the bell tower offers the most beautiful views of the medieval design of the streets.

# LET THE BAROOUE PALACE **SURPRISE YOU**

The three-storey Late Baroque Palace Besenghi degli Ughi is surely the most beautiful building in Istria. Discover its luxury. Can you find the lion at the corner of the building? Explore the palace virtually with the help of a 3D model!

## **DISCOVER THE MARITIME** TRADITION

The very centre of the town is home to a small centuries old picturesque harbour, known locally as mandrač. This is where Izola's smaller boats moor. The popular city beach by the lighthouse is only a few steps away.

# **ENTER THE TOWN THROUGH** THE MUDA GATE

The only preserved gate of the former wall. The gates were once the entry point to the town, connected only by a bridge between the island and the mainland. Above the door you are greeted by the sun - the symbol of the city with the largest number of sunny days in Slovenia.

# **STOP BY THE PRAETORIAN PALACE**

This magnificent building has historically been the seat of city administrators for centuries. Its facade depicts the statue of justice along with numerous coats of arms. Nowadays the palace serves as a starting point for tourists. Inside you can find a shop selling Istrian products and souvenirs together with an old pharmacy dating back to the 18th century.

The treasures of the luxurious Koper Serenissima - the 500-year period of the Venetian Republic - await you. Koper's history dates to the prehistoric era, when it was still an island and goats grazed on its fresh grass. Today the town is connected to land by Škocjanski Zatok Nature Reserve, home to hundreds of birds of different species, as well as by the Port of Koper and the hinterland with many attractive locations.

# **CLIMB UP THE TOWN'S TOWER**

204 steps lead to the viewing platform on top of the bell tower, housing the oldest working bell in Slovenia. Take a look down on the city of fountain squares and its green surroundings.

The peninsula with a mild climate and lush Mediterranean vegetation was the holiday destination for Venetian monks in the Middle Ages. Today's ANKARAN Ankaran, with its Debeli Rtič Landscape Park, is a place of retreat for people searching for nature, wellness and camping.

# **DIFFERENT AGES OF THE MOST BEAUTIFUL CAPE**

THE PLEASURE OF REST

Debeli Rtič, translated to Fat Cape, is home to fascinating relics of time. Visit the only fully preserved historical farm on the Slovenian coast, a once public oven for baking bread, as well as bunkers and fortified cannon positions from the Second World War and the lookout tower, reminders of a diverse bygone culture.

Visitors have always been attracted to this area by the pleasant climate and the area's diversity. Admire the gardens of the Benedictine monastery, where monks shared their knowledge of healing as early as the 11th century. You can also visit the spa park of the former Sanatorium.

Explore the surroundings on foot along the circular Bebler's Trail, which connects the centre of Ankaran with the hill by the Sanatorium. Alternatively, embark on a walk along one of the recreational trails in the landscape park or follow an educational trail among the vineyards.

# **AUTHENTIC.**

The green hills of Slovenian Istria are teeming with friendly places and villages. They are surrounded by Istrian olive groves, vineyards and orchards. The delicacies from Istrian gardens are complemented with unique edible vegetation. Here the wells are precious, and the courtyards are protected from the sea by stone fences.

# **ISTRIAN ARCHITECTURE**

There are more than 100 villages and hamlets in Slovenian Istria. Many impress with their image of a close-knit community settled by the old church. One such example is **Padna**, a heritage protected village surrounded by olive groves. The picturesque Šmarje, a village above Koper, is another example where the church and the village square showcase Istrian architecture.

# SOURCES OF POSITIVE ENERGY

Water has always played a major role in sustaining life in Istria. A simple freshwater tap, an animal trough and a laundry trough were all important



sources of clean water. Examples of such items can still be found in the village of Korte and its surroundings. The Istrian hinterland

is also filled with the aroma of Mediterranean vegetation, wild and cultivated herbs. They can be found in **Trsek**, a village above the Dragonja valley. That is also where the energy labyrinth is.

# **RESPECTED KNOWLEDGE**

Istrian villages are a great place to learn traditional skills. One such place is the former oil mill at the Tona's House Ethnological Museum located in Sv. Peter. Make sure to also visit the Museum House of Kapeluča in Nova Vas.

# NATURA

On the Karst Edge near the village of Sočerga, where the limestone Karst transforms into flysch Istria, you will find overhanging rocky cliffs affectionally known as the Ears of Istria. Search for picturesque waterfalls in the valley of the Dragonja River, which impresses with its pools and meanders. The Slovenian Adriatic Coast is almost entirely environmentally protected. We have three landscape parks and an important nature reserve.





## STRUNJAN

The Strunjan Landscape Park, sheltered by an 80-meter-high Debeli Rtič Landscape Park stretches over 800 meters along flysch cliff, protects the longest section of the natural coast the coast of the Ankaran Peninsula and includes a 200-meter area of sea with a rocky bottom and diverse marine fauna and in the entire Gulf of Trieste. Below the cliff you will find the Moon Bay - the most beautiful Slovenian sea bay with flora. The park's cliffs measure 12 to 21 meter in height. The a pebble beach. # **DEBELI RTIČ**

The Ankaran Peninsula contains Slovenia's only Mediterranean salt meadow. You can explore it by walking on a raised educational wooden path. The display pool contains remains of shells once belonging to snails and seashells as found on the "shell cemetery", a stretch of coast scattered with the remains of as many as 234 species of marine molluscs from the Gulf of Trieste.

# **CULTURAL**.

Enjoy getting to know Koper, Izola and Piran. Enjoy exploring the picturesque streets, squares, palaces, villas, churches and monasteries. Make sure to take time to also enjoy museums and galleries, and discover unique cultural curiosities found in smaller Istrian towns and villages.

Istria was a hospitable area to live in even back in the pre-historic era. We know that as the remains of a settlement dating back to the 5th millennium BC were found at the Kaštelir archaeological site near Korte. To relive the ancient Roman era visit the Simon's Bay Archaeological Park where you can see the remains of a former seaside villa and a harbour.

Kaštelir and the remains of the Roman period can also be found near Ankaran. The monastery of St. Nicholas (now a hotel) invites you to visit and view its gardens together with a preserved stone sarcophagus from the Middle Ages.

In **Ankaran** you will find both pebble and stone beaches lined from Debeli Rtič to **Valdoltra**.

# **CYCLING ALL AROUND**

Istria is a paradise for cyclists. Ride along the coast or go on a journey through the hinterland. One of the most popular routes is the **Porečanka / Parenzana Health and Friendship Trail**, a 130 kilometre long panoramic trail along the former narrow-gauge railway, which travels partly along the coast and partly through the rugged hinterland. You can also take part in several cycling challenges.

The Karst Edge is one of the favourite locations for sport climbers from all over the world. There are more than 500 routes of various levels of difficulty in Osp and Črni Kal combined. Even the most nit-picking climbers will find climbing the Mišja Peč routes a real challenge. This overhang semi-circular wall offers routes with difficulty levels up to 9b! If you are unsure whether rock climbing is for you, visit Slovenia's largest boulder climbing centre in Koper.

#### PIRAN'S SALT AND ISTRIAN THE LIQUID GOLD OF **TUBERS**

The flavours of the Mediterranean and Istrian cuisine are brought to the fore by hand harvested Piran salt, which also possesses a protected designation of origin. Truffles, the aromatic underground tubers of Istria, receive an even nobler taste with a pinch of Piran salt flower.

# **ISTRIAN OLIVES AND THE** TASTES OF THE SEA

The extra virgin olive oil native to Slovenian Istria, with a protected designation of origin, is cold pressed from fresh olive fruits. Olive varieties and specific climatic conditions affect the characteristic taste of oil, which is so alluring to judges at international evaluations. Olive oil enhances the taste of true mussels and other seafood delicacies.

The Istrian wine-growing region is home to a variety of wines, the most famous being Refosco and Malvasia. The ruby red Refosco has a recognizable fruitiness and a slightly lower level of alcohol, while the white Malvasia is discreetly sour and has a characteristic flower. Both varieties of wine go well served with Istrian dishes!
